

Geoff Krill - Senior Sports Coordinator, New England Disabled Sports

Geoff Krill's career path initially pointed toward the hotel, restaurant, and hospitality industry, but a snowmobile accident in 1995 redirected his journey. That unexpected turn opened the door to a life filled with remarkable experiences, travel to incredible destinations, and connections with inspiring people.

Geoff's involvement with New England Disabled Sports (NEDS) began as a student and quickly evolved into a volunteer instructor. By the end of that first season, he was hooked. He went on to serve as Sports Director for many years before transitioning to Training Manager for Loon Mountain's Ski and Snowboard School.

Now returning to NEDS as Senior Sports Coordinator, Geoff's primary focus is to develop and manage year-round adaptive training for volunteer instructors and staff, ensuring the highest standards of PSIA/AASI instruction for winter sports and equally high standards for summer sports. He oversees adaptive sport lesson scheduling, coordinates volunteer availability, and matches volunteers with students, while also facilitating the sharing of volunteers between resorts. Additionally, Geoff plays a key role in recruiting both volunteers and student-athletes of all abilities, helping to expand and strengthen the NEDS community.

A highly respected leader in adaptive sports education, Geoff is currently serving his fifth term on the Professional Ski Instructors of America (PSIA) National Demonstration Team, which allows him to share his expertise at ski areas across the country while continually learning from others. As a PSIA examiner in the Eastern Division, he plays a pivotal role in training and mentoring new instructors. Geoff also contributes to the industry through his work on the Steering Committee of the Adaptive Board of Education for PSIA-Eastern and the Education Leadership Council at the National level.

Beyond NEDS, Geoff has helped develop and lead other nonprofit adaptive programs, including Eastern Adaptive Sports and the Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital Adaptive Ski Club. His passion for adaptive sports extends beyond the slopes—he enjoys speaking to students of all ages about overcoming challenges, embracing adversity, and finding adventure through sports like downhill mountain biking, skiing, road cycling, and waterskiing.



Geoff's dedication to adaptive sports and outdoor adventure has earned him numerous accolades, including induction into the Disabled Sports USA Ski Hall of Fame (2017) and a "40 Under 40" leadership award for the state of New Hampshire. He is also proud of his first wheelchair ascents of Lafayette, Galehead, and Lonesome Lake.

Geoff lives in North Woodstock, New Hampshire with his wife, Heather—an English teacher and blogger for the Christopher and Dana Reeve Foundation—and their two children, Carver (15) and Greta (14). He firmly believes that sports have shaped his path, guiding him to achieve each goal he sets. He is excited to return to NEDS, where he can continue championing adaptive sports, mentoring instructors and staff, and empowering athletes of all abilities.
